Day Center Volunteer Needed – Wednesdays

We have an opening on Wednesdays for a Day Center volunteer. This is an ongoing opportunity and we need an individual who can commit to most Wednesdays. The appropriate candidate should have his or her own transportation or be able to use public transportation efficiently and be available from 9 AM to at least noon, but can stay as late as 2 PM. This person will help oversee our Day Center where homeless clients take showers, receive services and meet with other professionals to address their needs. Main duties include ensuring all clients sign in using appropriate logs, distributing sandwiches, coffee cups, towels and hygiene items, and referring clients to other services in the agency.
